KIFEG volunteers also volunteer their time to train Keats Island residents on how to use the fire fighting equipment.

Your KIFEG volunteers **ARE NOT** your volunteer fire department. It is your responsibility to know what to do in case of a fire and how to use the equipment. For this purpose KIFEG volunteers organize several training sessions each year, and are available outside of these times to orient you to the equipment.

YOU are responsible for fighting your own fires on Keats Island.

If you don't' know how to use the equipment, its useless. Please take the time to attend a training session; it may save your home and the island.

FIRE ON KEATS ISLAND

In 2014 there were no reported out-ofhand fires on Keats Island.

This contrasts with Gambier Island where two major fires burned down homes in the last two years. Keats and Gambier share a similar lack of firefighting infrastructure and scarce water resources during the summer months.

If a fire were to reach the forested areas bordering Eastbourne or Keats Landing there is no physical barrier to the fire burning out of control.

We hope it doesn't take a fire to increase interest in fire prevention and training.

FIRE EQUIPMENT TRAINING DATES

Fire equipment training will be held twice this year on the following dates:

Get hands-on experience setting up and using the Equipment. Learn what to do in case of a fire and practice learning how to access and use the equipment.







KIFEG FIRE EQUIPMENT

If you have attended a training session you will have had hands on experience with our equipment.

For those of you that have not familiarized yourselves with the equipment, it contains:

- 6 water pumps
- Hundreds of feet of fire hose
- An assortment of water nozzles for various uses
- Sprinkler systems
- Foam backpacks
- Several shovels, axes
- Hard hats, fire fighting suits, gloves, safety glasses
- First aid equipment, including oxygen and two defibrillators
- · And much more...

The code to enter the Fire Shed and the Fire Trailer is 9111.

Please see the **KIFEG Quick Reference Guide** for details on how to assemble the basic equipment.

WHAT TO DO IN CASE OF A FIRE

- 1. Sound one of the fire alarms (outside Gord Pay's house and Rick Hickman's house on trees)
- 2. Call for help: your neighbors and friends. There is a list of KIFEG volunteers and their phone numbers posted on the wall in the Fire Shed.
- 3. Call 911 or Wildfire BC at *5555 to report the location of the fire and ask for assistance
- Dress appropriately: long pants/sleeves, boots, hat, gloves
- 5. Bring food, water and hand tools: shovels, axe, rake
- 6. Go to the Fire Shed, record the location of the

fire on the map and leave instructions for others

- 7. Hook up trailer to truck or load equipment into boats and go to fire location
- 8. Leave kids at home!
